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Strategic Planning

Governors have worked closely with staff to draw up our Strategic Plan (2024 – 2027) outlining our longer term aims for the school. The key priorities are:

• The number of pupils on roll increases and the school moves towards becoming one form entry.

Among other things, this would remove the need for a three year rolling curriculum cycle.

We are a small school hub of excellence.

Our experiences of managing the National Curriculum across mixed age classes, ensuring that every child receives their full entitlement, mean that we now have the capacity to support other schools. We are also working closely with the West Sussex Maths Hub and Mr Griffin is completing Maths Leadership training with them, prior to strengthening practice in other schools.

 The school promotes itself effectively through raising its public profile.

We have much to celebrate and be proud of. We need to ensure that we share this effectively. One of our first steps is to relaunch the school website with a more modern, easily navigable version. You can all help by using word-of-mouth and social media to share our success stories.

Solar Panels

At the end of September, eleven months after installation, our solar panels have already saved the school £8067.68 in electricity costs. Because of the grants we received, this means we have already recouped our initial investment of £5,000. Every pound saved from this point forward will directly benefit our children, allowing us to reinvest in resources, learning opportunities, and projects that enhance their education and wellbeing. We are excited to see how these ongoing savings will support the future growth of our school community.



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New Governors

Following the resignation of **Peter Bird** a year ago, the Governing Body took some time to take stock of our collaborative skills and to identify gaps. We then asked for volunteers and were delighted when three candidates stepped forward giving us the luxury of selecting the candidates who were best placed to address the gaps in our skills. At the same time, **Victoria Baxter**, who had been a very active Governor for five years, decided to step down. Victoria's portfolio included 'Communication' and she revamped our website, making sure it was fit for purpose despite the technical challenges that accompanied its age. She also introduced these termly Governor newsletters. Victoria also championed 'wellbeing' for all staff, pupils and volunteers, raising its profile impressively. She has left an impressive legacy and will be missed.

We welcome two new Governors. **Jessica Martin** lives in Barns Green with her husband and young daughter. She works as a doctor in Surrey and will use her experience of child development and safeguarding to do what she can to support the school to succeed in providing an excellent education for our children.
